
STUDENTS WITH DISABILTIES

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UNDERSTANDING DATA SOURCES FOR THE REPORT CARDS

The data used in the <u>Accountability Report Cards</u> come from a variety of sources and across multiple years. The most recent administrative data are reported through WISEdata, while older data are from ISES. In future years, all data will come from WISEdata. Therefore, understanding the importance of each WISEdata snapshot is key to having accurate report cards. This guide is meant to help administrators understand where the data on the report cards come from and how the data reported through WISEdata are incorporated in the report cards. Assessments Used in Accountability

- **Forward Exam**: state summative assessment given annually in the spring. Only the ELA and math results from FAY students in Grades 3-8 are factored into accountability report card scores.
- **ACT+Writing**: state summative assessment given annually in the spring. Only the ELA composite scores and mathematics composite scores from FAY students in Grades 11 are factored into accountability report card scores.
- **DLM**: the Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) assessment is an alternate assessment given annually in the spring to students with the most significant cognitive disabilities who are unable to participate in the Forward or ACT. Only the ELA and mathematics DLM results from FAY students in Grades 3-8 and 11 are factored into accountability report card scores.
- WAA-SwD: the Wisconsin Alternate Assessment for Students with Disabilities (WAA-SwD) was an alternate assessment given annually in the fall to students with the most significant cognitive disabilities who were unable to participate in the WKCE. Only the ELA and mathematics WAA-SwD results from FAY students in Grades 3-8 and 10 are factored into accountability report card scores.
- WKCE: the Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Exam (WKCE) was state summative assessment given annually in the fall. Only the ELA and math results from FAY students in Grades 3-8 and 10 are factored into accountability report card scores.

Key Terms

- FAY: full academic year (FAY) students. These are students who were enrolled from TFS through the end of the testing window.
- ISES: Individual Student Enrollment System. Data collection system that predated WISEdata. Public schools last used ISES for the 2015-16 school year; private schools never used the system. Because lagged data are used in the accountability report cards, some data from ISES are still used.
- **TFS**: Third Friday of September. A data collection that captures enrollment and demographic data.
- WISEdata: Current statewide data collection system. Public schools first began using WISEdata in the 2016-17 school year; private schools began in 2015-16.

Notes

- Attendance, absenteeism, dropout, and graduation data are lagged by one year due to data availability.
- Data from prior years reported on the current report cards incorporate past manual corrections completed during inquiry periods.
