#### New:

#### 2022-23 Assessment Data Public Release

Deputy State Superintendent John Johnson sent an <u>email to District Administrators</u> on Monday, October 2, announcing the public release of spring 2022-23 statewide assessment results for the Forward Exam, ACT, PreACT Secure, and DLM on October 10. A press release will be available on the DPI News Releases webpage and performance data from these assessments will be available in the <u>WISEdash public portal</u> on that day.

#### 2022-23 Preliminary Secure Report Cards - Now Available in SAFE

Deputy State Superintendent John Johnson sent an <u>email to District Administrators</u> today, October 3, announcing that **secure preliminary versions of the 2022-23 School and District Report Cards are available in** <u>SAFE</u>, the Secure Access File Exchange. As a preliminary and secure report, they contain potentially identifiable student information, and have not been redacted. As such, and because the report cards are preliminary and subject to change, the secure reports and any information on the preliminary report cards may not be shared with your local media, parents, or members of the community.

To ensure reporting is as accurate as possible, the secure release opens the <u>report card inquiry period</u>, which will take place between October 3-16. This inquiry period is an opportunity for schools and districts to review report card data and work with OEA to address possible data submission errors prior to the final release of report cards. The 'Secure Release Checklist' found on the <u>report card resources page</u> provides step-by-step guidance on how to review report card data. **The last day to OPEN a data inquiry is October 16**.

The public release of final school and district report cards is scheduled for **November 14**. These report cards will include redaction to protect student privacy. At that time the public school and district report cards results will be widely available.

#### Target Group Preview Dashboard Updated for 2023-24

This Target Group Preview Dashboard is now available for 2023-24, showing the likelihood of students appearing in the target group of the 2023-24 report cards, based on 2023 assessment results. Please note that this dashboard is a "forward facing" tool used to inform continuous improvement efforts, so it does not reflect target group students found in the 2022-23 report cards.

The Target Group Outcomes priority area of the report cards is designed to help schools see their own "gaps" between students scoring in the lowest quartile and the rest of their student body. To support schools and districts in identifying and serving their lowest-performing students, students who are *likely* to be in the target group in future report cards at a district- and school-level are displayed securely on WISEdash for Districts.

This dashboard can be found in the 'Early Warning' area of WISEdash for Districts under 'Report Card.' The data will be updated weekly from now through the December Snapshot as enrollment numbers stabilize.
