Assessment

Reminder:

District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) Confidentiality Agreement

DACs from districts administering the ACCESS for ELLs who have not already completed the 2023-24 <u>DAC Confidentiality Agreement</u> should do so now and submit to OEA as soon as possible. The form may be completed electronically and signed electronically using Acrobat Reader. Be sure to read the terms for each assessment and select the appropriate options on the ACT agreement prior to signing. The entire document needs to be submitted to OEA once signed. If your district is not administering the ACCESS for ELLs for 2023-24, be sure to submit your form by March 1. All other confidentiality forms (SACs, DTCs, STCs, etc.) remain individual forms, but may be completed electronically, and once completed are to be retained at the school/district level.

2023-24 JFN Release Timeline

Beginning in the 2023-24 school year, the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) reports will be available in February and April as part of the Joint Federal Notification (JFN) packet. This new timeline differs from years past, in which the preliminary JFN release typically took place in December. Selecting 2024 ACT Test Date/Window - Deadline

The deadline for selecting your 2024 ACT testing date/window is **December 8.** Schools should select test dates, testing mode, shipping dates, and verify addresses **under each high school profile** in PearsonAccess^{met}. If your school/district has a conflict that would prevent testing in Test Window 1 or 2, please reach out to <u>Nikki Braconier</u> for assistance. The FCS and PNPs must be completed for students to receive testlets. The FCS and PNP can be completed now and should be completed by a person who knows the students' abilities well.

Forward Exam

New:

Educator Involvement Opportunities

DPI is currently recruiting a diverse group of Wisconsin educators from all over Wisconsin (including English learner and special education teachers) to participate in three separate Forward Exam Educator Involvement Opportunities. These events are all important steps in the development and scoring of the Forward Exam. This is a great opportunity to be a part of the Forward Exam development and scoring, have detailed input on the exam, and take knowledge back to your district about the processes.

- **Rangefinding** Participants will review student writing responses to finalize the short write rubrics, approve scoring guides, and select anchor, training, and qualifying papers used by evaluators to score the Forward Exam new ELA short write tasks.
- **Standard Setting** Participants will recommend cut scores for the Forward Exam in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics. The cut scores separate students into one of the four achievement levels, which provide clear indicators of a student's level in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards and indicate if they are on track for future learning.
- **New Item Review** Participants will review new ELA, mathematics, science, and social studies test questions created for the exam for content, grade level appropriateness, alignment to correct standard, cultural inclusivity, and bias/sensitivity issues prior to placement on the exam.

The NAEP High School Transcript Study (HSTS) data collection is now open in the <u>NAEP Assessment</u> <u>Management System (AMS)</u>. HSTS Coordinators will complete the course catalog submission and the transcript information survey, which are open through the **end of January**. The last step of the HSTS is the student transcript submission which will open in the summer of 2024.
