Statewide Assessment Windows are Closed

We would like to thank everyone for administering the spring Statewide Assessments. Your attention to detail helps to ensure all students have the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and skills. We appreciate you and the time and effort you put into assessing our students.

Sharing Results from the Wisconsin Student Assessment System

DPI publicly releases summary test score data for the Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS) in the fall. As such, DPI strongly recommends that districts coordinate their own public release with the DPI public release. After the secure release of results to districts and prior to the public release, DPI performs additional quality assurance, data validation, and data redaction when needed to protect student privacy.

Districts may share their summary assessment results with their school boards prior to the DPI public release. Districts may not publicly share personally identifiable information and therefore would be responsible to ensure shared results are redacted to comply with data security and student privacy requirements, as outlined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and state law. More information about maintaining student data privacy is available on the Student Data Privacy webpage.

District summary data may be shared with district and school staff who understand the data security and student privacy requirements outlined in FERPA and state law. This allows district staff to use the data for professional development, continuous improvement efforts, and other planning purposes. Districts may share individual student reports with parents or guardians, teachers, school leaders, and others with a legitimate interest.

Districts should not share the statewide data reported in the vendor portals. This data has not yet been through DPI's quality assurance and validation process and is therefore subject to change. Final statewide results, which are used in accountability calculations, will be released in WISEdash in the fall.

Spring Demographic Snapshot - May 23

DPI will conduct the WISEdata Spring Demographic Snapshot on May 23. Please take this opportunity to review your student data to ensure your enrollment and demographic values are up-to-date and accurate for the snapshot. These data will be used to make sure that demographics associated with, and reported for, assessment results are as accurate and timely as possible. PreACT Secure Scores

Student scores from PreACT Secure testing are appearing in ACT's Online Reporting System (<u>Success.ACT</u>). Scores will appear in batches and not all student scores will be received at the same time. Review the <u>May 1, PreACT Secure DPI program email</u> for additional guidance, resources and training.

Note: The data in ACT's online reporting system will not be final until May 27. Schools should not download Individual Student Reports (ISRs) until May 27.

DLM Score Reports

The DLM Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports will be electronically available to districts in the Educator Portal on June 16. Be sure to provide parents/guardians with ISRs as soon as possible after electronic receipt.

DLM External Review of Testlets

DLM, through ATLAS (Accessible Teaching, Learning, & Assessment Systems), will be hosting an external review of testlets this summer. The external review will include Science, Math, and ELA testlets. Testlets are reviewed for content, accessibility, sensitivity, and bias. Please pass along this information to teachers you feel would like to participate in this process. DLM is looking for general education content area teachers as well as teachers who work with students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. Forward Exam Reports

Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports will be available electronically in the DRC INSIGHT Portal on June 16. Hard copy ISRs will be delivered to districts by July 14. Be sure to send ISRs out to parents/guardians as soon as possible after receipt, either in hard copy or via your secure parent portal.



Additional Electronic Individual Student Reports (ISR) Option

All districts will receive two electronic versions of ISRs in DRC INSIGHT Portal.

- One PDF with all students, in all grades, in all schools, in the district (sorted by grade, then school).
- One PDF for each school and grade in the district.

Districts may choose to request an additional electronic PDF format which would include separate PDFs for each student's ISR. This format allows for easier upload of the ISRs to your student information system (SIS) or secure parent portal. If you would like to receive separate PDFs for each student, you must complete and submit a 2023 Forward Exam Additional Electronic ISR File Format Delivery Option Request Form by May 31.

Option to Decline Paper ISRs

All districts currently receive two electronic versions of ISRs (with an optional third upon request) and two paper copies (one for the student file and the other one to be shared with the parent/guardian). Districts now have the option to decline the paper ISRs by having their DAC complete and submit the 2023 Forward Exam Request to Decline Paper Individual Student Reports (ISRs) Form by May 31. Districts are still required to provide parents/guardians with a secure electronic copy or paper copy of the ISR.

Forward Exam Not-Test Codes

District Assessment Coordinators (DACs) must enter a Not-Tested Code (NTC) in the DRC INSIGHT Portal for all students who were unable to be tested, including students who participated in the DLM. The deadline to enter Not-Test Codes is Friday, May 5. Students must be in a test session in order to view, assign, or edit their NTC. Information on assigning NTCs is available on p. 32 of the DRC INSIGHT Portal Guide.
