

## Summer Food Service Program vs. At-Risk Afterschool Program

The chart summarizes the requirements for the [Summer Food Service Program](#) (SFSP) and the CACFP [At-Risk Afterschool Program](#).

	Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)	At-Risk Afterschool Meal Program through the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)
<b>Sponsor Eligibility</b>	Any public school, nonprofit private school, local government agency, or private nonprofit organization. All SFSP programs are referred to as “Sponsors”.	Same as SFSP, in addition to some for-profit entities. The term “Sponsor” for At-Risk programs, refers only to programs with more than one site.
<b>Site Eligibility</b>	<p>A site qualifies either as an open or an enrolled site. Schools offering academic summer school, must be an open site.</p> <p><b>Open Site</b> School Data: A site must be located in the attendance area of an elementary, middle, or high school having a School Eligibility percentage of 50% or more based on the most recent Free/Reduced-priced data or Community Eligibility Provision data. <b>OR</b> Census Data: A site must be located within a census tract that qualifies. The <a href="#">USDA Capacity Builder Map</a> can assist in finding areas within a community that qualify.</p> <p>Once established using school or census data, eligibility remains in effect for five years.</p> <p><b>Enrolled Site</b> Site may use School or Census data OR will qualify if at least half of the children enrolled in the program are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals.</p>	<p><b>School Data:</b> A site must be located in the attendance area of a qualifying public school or within the qualifying school building (an elementary, middle, or high school). A qualifying school has 50 percent or more Free/Reduced (F/R) students based on the current <a href="#">Wisconsin Public School Eligibility Data Report</a>.</p> <p>Once established, eligibility remains in effect for five years.</p>
<b>Program Requirements</b>	No requirement.	<p>Programs must provide educational or enrichment activities that are open to all children in an organized, structured, and supervised environment.</p> <p>Organized athletic programs engaged in interscholastic or community level sports are not eligible afterschool care programs.</p>

## Summer Food Service Program vs. At-Risk Afterschool Program

	Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)	At-Risk Afterschool Meal Program through the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)
<b>Participant Eligibility</b>	<p>Children 18 years or younger and persons 19 or older with a physical disability, as defined by the State.</p> <p><b>Open sites:</b> Open to all children in the community (open restricted sites limit or restrict participation for reasons of safety, security or control).</p> <p><b>Enrolled sites:</b> Only provides meals to children enrolled in the program.</p>	<p>School age children through age 18.</p> <p>Children may be either drop-in or enrolled.</p> <p>Attendance records required.</p>
<b>Meal Service</b>	<p>During the summer months or during student vacations for year round schools.</p> <p>Maximum two meals (breakfast, lunch, supper, or snack) per day, except 3 meals per day for migrant sites and camps (only reimbursed for children who are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals).</p> <p>Lunch and supper cannot be reimbursed for the same day by the same site, except for camp and migrant sites.</p>	<p>Any one meal (breakfast, lunch, or supper) and/or a snack may be claimed during school year, weekends, holidays, and school vacations (e.g. spring break).</p>
<b>Supervision</b>	<p>Children need to remain on-site when eating their meal.</p>	<p>Meals and snacks must be offered to and consumed by the participants while under the agency's supervision.</p>
<b>Food Leaving the Site</b>	<p>Only a single fruit/vegetable or a grain/bread item may be taken off-site (this is left to the discretion of the sponsor whether or not to allow this).</p>	<p>Only a single fruit/vegetable or a grain item may be taken off-site (this is left to the discretion of the agency whether or not to allow this).</p>
<b>Reimbursement Rates</b>	<p>The current <a href="#">SFSP Reimbursement Rates</a> can be found on the Summer Food Service Program webpage.</p>	<p>The current CACFP Reimbursement rates can be found on the <a href="#">At-Risk Afterschool Program Guidance Memorandums</a> page under 2: Reimbursement Rates.</p>
<b>Training</b>	<p>Sponsors are required to annually train all the SFSP staff, including their monitors, site supervisors, and any other staff with SFSP duties.</p>	<p>All staff with CACFP responsibilities are required to be trained annually. Depending on the type of program (Independent, Sponsor and/or SFA) and the type of site (new or returning) determines the topics required for training.</p>



<p><b>Meal Pattern</b></p>	<p><b>Breakfast</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 serving of milk,</li> <li>• 1 serving of fruit or vegetable, &amp;</li> <li>• 1 serving of grains/bread</li> </ul> <p><b>Lunch/Supper</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 serving of milk,</li> <li>• 2 servings of fruits and/or vegetables,</li> <li>• 1 serving of grain/bread,</li> <li>• 1 serving of meat or meat alternate</li> </ul> <p><b>Snack (must include two of the following)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 serving of milk,</li> <li>• 1 serving of fruit and/or vegetable,</li> <li>• 1 serving of grain/bread,</li> <li>• 1 serving of meat/meat alternate</li> </ul> <p>The agency must comply with the minimum serving size requirements in the SFSP Meal Pattern.</p> <p>School Food Authorities (SFA) may substitute School Breakfast Program (SBP)/National School Lunch Program (NSLP) meal patterns.</p>	<p><b>Breakfast</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 serving of milk,</li> <li>• 1 serving of fruit or vegetable, &amp;</li> <li>• 1 serving of grains</li> </ul> <p><b>Lunch/Supper</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 serving of milk,</li> <li>• 1 serving of vegetable,</li> <li>• 1 serving of fruit or a second vegetable,</li> <li>• 1 serving of grains, &amp;</li> <li>• 1 serving of meat or meat alternate</li> </ul> <p><b>Snack (must include two of the following)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 serving of milk,</li> <li>• 1 serving of fruit,</li> <li>• 1 serving of vegetable,</li> <li>• 1 serving of grains,</li> <li>• 1 serving of meat/meat alternate</li> </ul> <p>The agency must comply with the minimum serving size requirements in the <a href="#">CACFP Meal Pattern</a>.</p> <p>SFAs may choose to use the CACFP or NSLP meal pattern.</p>
<p><b>Offer Vs. Serve (OVS)</b></p>	<p>All SFSP sites, regardless of the location or type of sponsor, may use OVS in their SFSP at breakfast or lunch/supper.</p> <p><b>Breakfast</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 <b>Food Components</b> are required for a reimbursable meal</li> <li>• 4 different <b>Food Items</b> must be offered             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Fourth item can be fruit/vegetable, bread/grain, or meat/meat alternate</li> </ul> </li> <li>• A child may decline 1 <b>Food Item</b> offered at breakfast             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Any 1 of the 4 items</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p>All AR sites may use OVS at breakfast, lunch, or supper. OVS may not be used at a snack.</p> <p><b>Breakfast</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 <b>Food Components</b> are required for a reimbursable meal</li> <li>• 4 different <b>Food Items</b> must be offered             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Fourth item can be fruit/vegetable, grain, or meat/meat alternate</li> </ul> </li> <li>• A child may decline 1 <b>Food Item</b> offered at breakfast             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Any 1 of the 4 items</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Serve (OVS) (continued)</b></p>	<p><b>Lunch or Supper</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 4 <b>Food Components</b> required, must be offered through at least 5 <b>Food Items</b>:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ One serving of meat/meat alternate;</li> <li>○ Two different servings of fruit/vegetable;</li> <li>○ One serving of grain/bread;</li> <li>○ One serving of fluid milk.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>A child must take at least 3 of the 4 <b>Food Components</b>, rather than 3 <b>Food Items</b>, to meet OVS requirements.</p> <p><b>Snack</b> OVS is not available for snacks, as snacks only contain two components</p>	<p><b>Lunch or Supper</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 5 <b>Food Components</b> required, must be offered through at least 5 <b>Food Items</b>:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ One serving of meat/meat alternate;</li> <li>○ Two different serving vegetable</li> <li>○ One serving of fruit or second vegetable;</li> <li>○ One serving of grains;</li> <li>○ One serving of fluid milk.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>A child must take at least 3 of the 5 <b>Food Components</b>, rather than 3 <b>Food Items</b>, to meet OVS requirements.</p> <p><b>Snack</b> OVS is not available for snacks, as snacks only contain two components</p>
<p><b>Monitoring</b></p>	<p>Pre-operational Visits are required for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• New sites</li> <li>• Sites with operational problems the previous year</li> <li>• Must be done prior to the program starting</li> </ul> <p>First Week Site Visits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• New sites</li> <li>• Sites with operational problems the previous year</li> </ul> <p>Site Reviews</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All sites must be reviewed at least once during the first four weeks of program operations.</li> </ul>	<p>Pre-operational Visit are required for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• New Sites</li> <li>• Sites closed for more than 1 month</li> <li>• Must be done prior to the program starting</li> </ul> <p>Reviews</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minimum of 3 reviews must be conducted</li> <li>• Two of the three reviews must be unannounced</li> <li>• One of the unannounced reviews must include a meal observation</li> <li>• No more than 6 months can lapse between reviews</li> </ul> <p>There are flexibilities with the monitoring requirements for agencies that participate in both the SFSP and At-Risk Afterschool Program or for School Food Authorities that are sponsors of the At-Risk Afterschool Program that also participate in the NSLP.</p>
