### American Rescue Plan – Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY) Part II Grant

The application and budget for the American Rescue Plan-Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY) Part II grant is now open in WISEgrants! ARP-HCY funds are specifically dedicated to support the identification, enrollment, and school participation of children and youth experiencing homelessness. ARP-HCY funds should be used in conjunction with other federal stimulus funds, federal and local funds.

All LEAs should make funding management selections by **March 4**, **2022**. Initial applications and budgets must be submitted by **June 4**, **2022**.

#### **Transportation Reimbursement Information**

DPI has received many questions about whether it is the role of an LEA to require proof of car insurance for families experiencing homelessness who are using their own vehicle to transport students to school.

Though car insurance is required in the state of Wisconsin, requiring proof of car insurance is not required of a district and in many cases creates a significant barrier to families and students experiencing homelessness. It is not an appropriate role of a district to intervene in personal financial or legal decisions of families in this way.

It is important to acknowledge that the McKinney-Vento Act requires districts to provide (and pay for) transportation to/from the school of origin but it does **not** require districts to reimburse parents for driving their students to/from school. Reimbursing parents or youth for driving to school and/or extracurricular activities is only one of several acceptable ways to provide required transportation and is most often the most cost-effective way. However, if the district chooses not to provide transportation reimbursement, then they **must** provide another safe and reasonable form of transportation, such as a school bus or taxi. ### Tax Refunds for Qualified Students Experiencing Homelessness

Qualifying youth experiencing homelessness and youth from foster care who are at least 18 years old are eligible for a \$1,502 tax refund through the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), even if they are full-time students. This is a departure from previous tax years, and of special importance to vulnerable youth who are still in high school or pursuing higher education. #### Recommendations for Awarding Partial Credits to Students Experiencing Homelessness

McKinney-Vento requires states and districts to have procedures to remove barriers that prevent students from receiving appropriate credit for full or partial coursework completed at a prior school. This new document was created by homeless liaisons from across the state and includes recommendations on how to award partial credit. District staff can adopt any of the recommendations that make sense in their own district.
