Whereas, the connection between social and emotional learning and online safety brings perspective, empathy, compassion, and the ability to understand how decision-making in online environments can affect other people; and

Whereas, cyber security is an essential component of the overall virtual environment, and the security of personally identifiable information while accessing digital resources is vital to students' educational success and physical and mental health; and

Whereas, October 1-31 is proclaimed "Keeping Kids Safe Online" month in Wisconsin to support schools, out of school time (before, after, and summer school) programs, families, libraries, and communities to promote the role that online safety and digital citizenship education have in producing engaged, empathetic, digital-age leaders who are future ready.
