

Nationwide 1 in 5 of youth ages 13-18 live with a mental health condition.



This is the 3rd worst in the nation



The average delay between onset of mental health symptoms and intervention is 8 to 10 years.

Radical Move

- Licensed Professional Counselor
- Social Emotional Learning defined as critical learning skills
 - Students failing to master critical content receive an intervention specific to individual needs
- Social Emotional Learning content is the responsibility of all of us

- Relationships
- Social Awareness
- Responsible Decision Making
- Self-Management



Social Emotional Learning Interventions

Social Emotional Learning

All students are provided social emotional learning opportunities in the general curriculum.

Some **SELECTED** students need just a little more support than others and are provided short term additional instruction based on their need.

A small number of students need to receive very intensive **Targeted** instruction to develop critical social emotional learning targets.

Some of these targeted students also need additional mental health services.

Middle & High School

- 1. Classes
- 2. 7 Homerooms
 - taught by teachers
 - 20 minutes weekly
- 3. Social Emotional Learning Class
 - taught by teachers & counselor
 - 60 minutes 5 times
 week

- 1. Guidance Classes
- 2. Small groups & CICO
 - Groups run by
 Guidance Counselor
 - teachers and support staff facilitate CICO
- 3. Individual Sessions

- Written Treatment Plan
- Better Coordination of Services-Wrap Around
- More Immediate Response for Both Services and Crisis Management
- Professional Development for Staff

Students Served

- This year a total of 85 students were provided counseling services.
- 61 Active Students (most students seen individually weekly but some are in small groups)
 - 32 HS/MS
 - 29 Elem
- Types of Needs Addressed
 - Trauma
 - Depression
 - Anxieties
 - Suicidal Ideations
 - Family Dynamic Issues
 - LGBTQ

Wrong Question: Why are we doing this?

The Real Question is: Why are others not doing this?
