Rural advisory council to meet in Denmark Wednesday

MADISON — A performance from Denmark High School music students and presentations on the district's career and technical education programs, including a facility tour, will highlight Wednesday's meeting of the State Superintendent's Advisory Council on Rural Schools, Libraries, and Communities from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the high school.

The meeting will kick off with a welcome from District Superintendent Luke Goral and greetings from Deputy State Superintendent Mike Thompson. Staff from the Department of Public Instruction will make presentations on "School Mental Health in Rural Wisconsin," with discussion framed around collaborative mental health grants, Youth Risk Behavior Survey data, training and support opportunities, and district success stories.
